

Organisations funded under the 2007 *Safer Suburbs Plan*

- **City of Salisbury - \$75,000 (SA).** This project allows for the installation of CCTV cameras in John Street, the main shopping street of Salisbury, to reduce crime and anti-social behaviour.
- **City of Swan - \$500,000 (WA).** The Creating Safer Places – Early Intervention and Response Project aims to detect and deter criminal activity within Ballajura through the installation of CCTV cameras (both fixed and mobile) and lighting.
- **City of Swan - \$500,000 (WA).** The Dungeon Youth Centre Project will contribute to the cost of constructing new premises for the Dungeon Youth Centre. The project aims to decrease the incidence of antisocial behaviour and criminal activity and promote constructive social relations by providing diversionary activities to young people in the Ballajura area.
- **Department for Transport, Energy and Infrastructure, South Australia Government - \$2,500,000 (SA).** The Interchange CCTV Systems Project aims to upgrade the current CCTV systems at Gawler, Elizabeth and Salisbury Railway Stations.
- **Moreton Bay Regional Council - \$1,000,000 (QLD).** This project will be completed in two stages, the first being a feasibility study with the community and local business. The second stage will be the implementation of CCTV and lighting in areas identified through the feasibility study.
- **Penrith City Council - \$300,000 (NSW).** The Cranebrook Street Lighting Enhancement Project will improve community safety in Cranebrook by providing street and pedestrian pathway lighting enhancements to reduce crime and antisocial behaviour.
- **Shire of Kalamunda - \$500,000 (WA).** This funding is for a number of community safety projects including the Youth and Early Intervention and Prevention Program and the employment of a Safer Communities Project Officer to work on crime prevention initiatives. A Safer Suburbs Project Officer will also be engaged to undertake an audit of public places and implement a CCTV strategy.
- **Springwood Chamber of Commerce - \$70,000 (NSW).** This project will install a CCTV network and upgrade lighting in the main shopping strip of Springwood, to help reduce crime, anti-social behaviour and vandalism.
- **Geelong City Council - \$300,000 (VIC).** The Central Geelong Safety Initiative Project aims to reduce crime and antisocial behaviour within the city centre through a variety of initiatives including; the upgrading of CCTV cameras and lighting; the establishment of a safe taxi rank; a night rider bus and community education workshops.
- **Tweed Shire Council - \$200,000 (NSW).** The Bus Shelters Security and Vandal Resistant Retrofit Project aims to address the issue of vandalism of bus shelters in the Tweed Shire by upgrading shelters with vandal resistant panels and installing street lights.
- **City of Wanneroo - \$1,000,000 (WA).** The CCTV Detection Capacity Project aims to install CCTV (including mobile units) in ‘hot spot’ sites within the city with an emphasis on managing graffiti.
- **Alice Springs City Council - \$300,000 (NT).** The CCTV Monitoring Support Project aims to contribute to a wider initiative of CCTV and other crime prevention measures within the Todd Mall area of Alice Springs.

- **City of Belmont - \$1,400,000 (WA).** The AlarmAssist CCTV Project aims to detect and deter criminal activity within the City of Belmont through the installation of a CCTV system and allocation of alarms to residents and business owners.
- **City of Gosnells - \$500,000 (WA).** The Thornlie Civic Precinct Revitalisation and Creative Pod Project aims to reduce youth antisocial behaviour through a redesign of the Civic Precinct including the installation of CCTV cameras, a video streaming webcam. It will also partly fund youth early intervention measures through the establishment of a creative digital studio in the Amherst Village Community Centre.
- **City of Playford - \$75,000 (SA).** The Elizabeth Regional Centre Community Safety Project aims to improve community safety through the installation of CCTV cameras at the City of Playford Youth Precinct Skate Park, Northern Sound System and Aquadome.
- **City of Stirling - \$1,600,000 (WA).** The Additional Community Safety Measures Project aims to contribute to wider crime prevention measures within the City of Stirling. It will include additional security patrols vehicles (with global positioning systems), monitoring of hot spots by foot patrols and quad bikes for beach patrols.
- **City of Tea Tree Gully - \$75,000 (SA).** This project allows for the installation of lighting at the Golden Grove Recreation and Arts Centre in an aim to reduce crime and anti-social behaviour.
- **Gosford City Council - \$680,000 (NSW).** The Peninsula CCTV Project aims to detect and deter antisocial behaviour by the installation of CCTV cameras in the Umina Beach, Woy Woy and Ettalong Beach precincts.
- **Northern Territory Government - \$2,250,000 (NT).** This funding will provide for the design and implementation of a CCTV system for the Darwin and Palmerston areas, which will focus on the highest priority hot spots identified by the Northern Territory Police.
- **Redland City Council - \$500,000 (QLD).** The Capalaba Youth Space project will provide a safe place where young people can engage in constructive activity and skill development aimed at reducing the incidence of crime and anti-social behaviour.
- **Town of Gawler - \$75,000 (SA).** This project aims to reduce crime and anti-social behaviour in Gawler by providing greater CCTV coverage of trouble spots, including civic parks. The CCTV system will be installed in consultation with police and local business.
- **Warrane Mornington Neighbourhood Centre Incorporated - \$495,000 (TAS).** The Training Opportunities and Options for Learning (TOOL) project will be delivered over two years and will address the lack of services for at-risk young people on the eastern shore of Hobart by supporting the development of personal, educational and vocational skills of individuals.

Organisations Funded under the 2010 *Safer Suburbs Program*

- **Clarence Valley Council - \$50,000 (NSW).** This funding is for an integrated Youth Activities and Transport program in the Lower Clarence, building on the success of Youth Activities Yamba (YAY). The Project aims to provide structured and semi structured activities on a regular fortnightly basis for 8 to 16 years olds to help prevent anti social behaviour.
- **Gosford City Council - \$30,000 (NSW).** The Fencing Around Playground at Fisherman's Wharf Project will build a fence around the playground at Fisherman's Wharf in Woy Woy. It aims to provide a safe play space for children and will assist parents and carers in their active supervision of their children.

- **Port Macquarie Hastings Council - \$20,000 (NSW).** The Midnight Basketball Project will run Midnight Basketball in Port Macquarie.
- **Logan City Council - \$400,000 (QLD).** The Beenleigh Safety Camera Project aims to enhance safety and minimise criminal activity and anti-social behaviour in the Beenleigh CBD. This will be achieved through the installation of up to nine (9) permanent Pan, Tilt and Zoom (PTZ) safety cameras in strategic priority locations within the Beenleigh CBD. The cameras will be proactively monitored 24 hours a day, seven days a week and the footage recorded to provide a response to crime, anti-social behaviour and community safety complaints.
- **City of Holdfast Bay - \$350,000 (SA).** The Glenelg Precinct Lighting & CCTV project will provide extra street lighting in High Street at Glenelg, New CCTV at the western corner of Colley Reserve and the rear of Glenelg Town Hall and relocation of CCTV at the taxi rank for better coverage. The Project aims to ensure appropriate controls (CCTV) are in place to monitor anti-social behaviour as well as security lighting around the jetty precinct and thereby protecting residents and visitors to the City.
- **City of Marion - \$100,000 (SA).** The Southbank Boulevard Reserve, Sheidow Park project aims to in partnership with the community, prevent and reduce crime and anti-social behaviour at the Southbank Boulevard Reserve, Sheidow Park, by implementing lighting and other crime prevention measures to provide a safe and amiable environment for local residents and reserve users.
- **Clarence City Council - \$80,000 (TAS).** The Public Lighting in Council Parks Project aims to reduce crime and anti-social behaviour and improve perceptions of safety for the community of Clarence. These objectives will be achieved though the implementation of lighting enhancements in parks and public spaces within the Clarence area.
- **Kingborough Council - \$145,000 (TAS).** The Kingston Safer Community Project aims to install CCTV in the Kingston CBD along with installation of lighting in public areas of Kingston to provide a safer community and help reduce anti social behaviour.
- **Launceston City Council - \$250,000 (TAS).** The Rocherlea Recreation Ground, Gymnasium and Sports Facility Project aims to reduce the crime rate in the northern suburbs of Launceston by providing a facility where community development programs can be run. This will be achieved by building a new gymnasium for the Rocherlea Football Club to run programs which encourage community participation in sporting activities.
- **Indigenous Sports Foundation Incorporated - \$100,000 (VIC).** The Ngootyun Marngrook – Strong, Proud and Kicking Goals Project will provide support for the Meerteeyt Marrang Indigenous Football Academy to run events including a week-long Indigenous summer football camp and local Indigenous soccer days, purchase essential equipment and develop a business plan for Stage 2 to ensure the ongoing sustainability of the Academy.
- **Ballarat City Council - \$100,000 (VIC).** The Ballarat CBD Safety Project (CCTV Extension) Project aims to increase community safety in Ballarat’s CBD as the city’s key next step of developing intervention, surveillance and prevention strategies. These objectives will be achieved though the implementation of an extension to existing high quality CCTV system in the city’s CBD.
- **Cardinia Shire Council - \$50,000 (VIC).** The Safety Camera Monitoring for Emerald Project aims to reduce the incidence of graffiti, criminal damage and anti-social behaviour in Emerald and its surrounding townships. These objectives will be achieved though the installation of safety monitoring cameras.

- **Maroondah City Council - \$200,000 (VIC).** The Ringwood CCTV Safety Program Project aims to reduce crime and anti-social behaviour within the Ringwood Central Activities District through the installation of a Closed Circuit Television (CCTV) system to enable ‘real-time’ monitoring at the Ringwood Bus Interchange and Train Station as well as other locations. This will provide Ringwood Police with the ability to respond to incidents as they occur.
- **City of Canning - \$125,000 (WA).** The Installation of Improved Lighting in Charles Treasure Park Project aims to significantly improve the safety of pedestrians using Charles Treasure Park and to decrease the incidence and likelihood of illegal activities within the park and adjoining private properties through the installation of lighting in the Park.
- **City of Mandurah - \$80,000 (WA).** The Safer City (Mandurah) - Business Partnership Project aims to raise awareness of safety issues in the City Centre’s entertainment Precinct by converting the Smart Street Mall CCTV trial into a permanent CCTV system.
- **Town of Victoria Park - \$100,000 (WA).** The Improved Security at the Burswood Train Station Project aims to improve visibility and safety around Burswood train station through the installation of lighting and CCTV cameras.
- **Waroona Senior Football Club - \$163,640 (WA).** The Waroona Oval Lighting Project will install lighting for the football field at Waroona Football Club to enable children and young people to participate in sport in the evening.
- **Ballina Shire Council - \$90,000 (NSW).** The Ballina Shire Crime Prevention Plan Project will identify strategic actions to mitigate criminal and anti-social behaviour in the local government area. The objective will be achieved developing a crime prevention plan for Ballina Shire, involving comprehensive community engagement and key agency and stakeholder participation via a crime prevention committee.
- **Clarence Valley Council - \$40,000 (NSW).** The Midnight Basketball Project aims to introduce and establish Midnight Basketball in the Clarence Valley as a diversionary and life skills program for young people on weekend nights, which are a high risk period of the week for teenagers. The project involves running two separate Midnight Basketball projects concurrently in separate locations: Upper Clarence (Grafton), and Lower Clarence (Yamba).
- **Gosford City Council - \$70,000 (NSW).** The Terrigal CCTV Project will facilitate the installation of CCTV cameras and other security measures within the Terrigal CBD.
- **Greater Taree City Council - \$20,000 (NSW).** GTCC will run a total of two Midnight Basketball tournaments over a 24 month period. The Midnight Basketball Project will aim to engage approximately 60 young people per tournament, with a particular focus on individuals from the local indigenous community. Dinner and compulsory life skills workshops will also be offered for participants.
- **Hawkesbury Council - \$100,000 (NSW).** The Installation of CCTV and Lighting upgrade Windsor Mall Project will install CCTV and Lighting at the Windsor Mall with wireless transmission to the Windsor Local Area Command.
- **Kyogle Shire Council - \$70,000 (NSW).** The Kyogle Council Safer Memorial Park Project will implement three crime prevention projects: \$30,000 for the renovation of the Kyogle Youth Centre, \$20,000 to improve safety at Cenotaph Park in Kyogle, \$20,000 for the preparation of a shire-wide Crime Prevention Plan.
- **Lismore City Council - \$100,000 (NSW).** The aim of the Goonellabah Plan Project is to expand upon the Proceeds of Crime Act 2002 funded ‘Changing the Tune Goonellabah Youth Plaza Project’. The project will aim to reduce crime and anti-social behaviour of Indigenous young

people aged 10-18 at Goonellabah Youth Plaza, Goonellabah Sport and Aquatic Centre, Goonellabah Business District and the broader Goonellabah community by employing a youth worker. The project will create opportunities to strengthen relationships between highly disaffected young people, local youth services, education providers and community Elders. The project will also create an Aboriginal Employment Strategy.

- **Liverpool City Council - \$50,000 (NSW).** The aim of the Graffiti Van Removal Project is to purchase a graffiti removal van to assist with graffiti removal in the Wattle Grove area.
- **National Association for Prevention of Child Abuse and Neglect (NAPCAN) - \$15,000 (NSW).** The aim of the Love Bites / Growing Respect Project is to prevent child abuse through the LoveBites Program to be run in all High Schools in Lyne by the National Association for Prevention of Child Abuse and Neglect (NAPCAN).
- **Penrith City Council - \$200,000 (NSW).** The Mondo Community Safety Program Project will extend CCTV coverage of the green space between the Joan Sutherland Performing Arts Centre, the Westfield Shopping Centre and the Penrith Civic Centre and engage local youth services to develop activities for local young people who use the space that discourage anti-social behaviour.
- **Richmond Valley Council - \$70,000 (NSW).** The Youth Engagement & Graffiti Clean Up will implement 2 crime prevention projects: \$42,000 for a clean-up crew to clean up graffiti and broken glass in Richmond Valley, \$28,000 for a Youth Engagement Strategy for Casino, Coraki and Evans Head, helping to engage with young people, including those at risk of turning to crime and anti-social behaviour.
- **Sutherland Shire Council - \$50,000 (NSW).** The Engadine Safer Suburbs Project aims to implement the recommendations from the Engadine Crime Risk Analysis, including graffiti removal and prevention, an audit of alcohol-free zones and a review of lighting in public places.
- **Ipswich City Council - \$250,000 (QLD).** The Rosewood and Walloon CCTV Project aims to increase community safety by reducing and preventing crime by installing CCTV cameras in Rosewood and Walloon and assisting police responses by relaying information back to the Ipswich City Council Safe City Monitoring room.
- **Townsville City Council - \$350,000 (QLD).** The Safer Suburbs Townsville Project will install CCTV and lighting at Riverway, Thuringowa and other crime hot spots identified in consultation with local police. It will implement a community night patrol pilot program, run in conjunction with the Queensland Knockouts Indigenous Corporation and local Indigenous elders. Targeted activities for young people, run in conjunction with the Townsville City Council.
- **Blackwood Business Network - \$100,000 (SA).** The Blackwood Safety and Security Project aims to achieve a sustainable, long term reduction in local incidents of crime and anti-social behaviour. The program strategy combines CCTV technology installed at identified critical trouble sites, monitored and responded to in real time by security patrols via mobile internet access located in patrol vehicles.
- **Devonport City Council - \$250,000 (TAS).** The 'A Safer Devonport for All' Project aims to increase safety in and around Devonport, including King St, Coles Beach, The Bluff and the East Devonport CBD. The project will upgrade and install new Closed Circuit Television Cameras (CCTV) in identified hot spots in Devonport.
- **City of Casey - \$175,000 (VIC).** The aim of the Safer Berwick Project is to work in partnership with the Berwick Village Chamber of Commerce to reduce crime and fear of crime in the Berwick Central Business District using a range of situational and social crime prevention measures. CCTV cameras will be installed in Berwick.

- **Knox City Council - \$175,000 (VIC).** The Boronia Major Activity Centre CCTV and Community Safety Project aims to undertake a comprehensive community safety project in Boronia with the installation of a CCTV system complemented by community safety and information programs. The programs will focus on improving the perceptions of safety and crime prevention initiatives that focus on developing community partnerships and resilience.
- **City of Armadale - \$50,000 (WA).** The Cross Park Skate Facility Rejuvenation Project aims to rejuvenate the skate park facility in Cross Park, Roleystone, in order to provide a safe space for young people to recreate and socialise in the community, ultimately leading to a reduction in anti-social behaviour and crime in the community. The project will facilitate community engagement in the re-design and re-development of the facility.
- **City of Gosnells - \$450,000 (WA).** The Str8 Talk'n Project aims to engage young people in the design and delivery of innovative educational and social programs that promote community safety and wellbeing and directly address anti-social behaviour. The intention is to implement long-term and sustainable approaches to reducing both the incidence and the fear of youth crime and antisocial behaviour in the communities of Thornlie and Langford through community engagement, capacity building and the development of positive relationships.
- **Serpentine Jarrahdale Shire - \$18,205 (WA).** The Forest Green / Half Court / Cricket Pitch for Disadvantaged Youths Project aims to construct a new Half Basketball Court for the youth of Jarrahdale and purchase equipment for sporting and social events for local young people.
- **St Matthew's Anglican Church - \$25,000 (WA).** The Legal Ink Project will aim to divert young people from vandalism to legal art work through a series of workshops to develop their skills and knowledge in a range of areas. It is expected that the Project will continue to lead a reduction in illegal graffiti in the greater Armadale district.
